The **third cycle** is mainly dedicated to the elaboration of a doctoral thesis, which must make a real contribution to the progress of moral theology. The personal method of investigation guided by the thesis moderators prevails. The course lasts at least six semesters and consists of the following stages:

1. Admission and Enrolment in the third cycle

2. Approval of the study plan and thesis topic

- 3. Approval of the thesis outline
- 4. Thesis delivery
- 5. Defence
- 6. Publication

The Alphonsian Academy requires a residence in Rome of at least one semester. Lectures and seminars are usually held in Italian.

The Alphonsian Academy, Pontifical Institute of Moral Theology, was founded by the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer on 9 February 1949 and is included as an Institute ad instar Facultatis in the Pontifical Lateran University as a centre of excellence for research and specialisation in moral theological disciplines.

In the Spirit of St. Alphonsus M. de Liguori, the one who renewed moral theology in his time, and in harmony with the Second Vatican Council and the Magisterium of the Church, the Alphonsian Academy renders special care in perfecting moral theology by paying particular attention to the knowledge of the human being as a whole, in his personal and Christian dimensions. Rooted always in the salvific Mystery of Christ the Redeemer, the Academy promotes the value and meaning of human life by discerning the norms for human behaviour in the individual, in the family, in civil society and in religious faith.

The Alphonsian Academy offers a programme including the following elements: the licentiate (second cycle) and doctorate (third cycle) in Moral Theology, the licentiate and doctorate in Moral Sciences and the possibility of a Post-doctorate.

Over 5.000 students who have been trained in the Academy give vital witness to the pastoral and doctrinal worth of the Institute.
